TRUCKEE RIVER MILFOIL REMOVAL

There is a significant population of Eurasian milfoil in the Truckee River, starting just below Lake Tahoe. Eurasian milfoil outcompetes native plants and affects the aquatic ecosystem. In partnership with the Tahoe Resource Conservation District, a group of volunteers from our Green Bucks partners, PlumpJack Squaw Valley Inn and Tahoe Mountain Resorts Lodging, assisted with this effort.

DONNER LAKE BOAT RAMP EROSION CONTROL

Chemical, Physical, and Habitat Monitoring

Join Adopt-A-Stream and commit to monitoring a stream four times a year, May through September. We provide training and equipment.

Biological Aquatic Monitoring

Collect and identify benthic macroinvertebrates (aquatic bugs and organisms) from local streams. The types of bugs found in a stream are strong indicators of water quality. Volunteers participate in lab sessions twice a month each winter. To volunteer, call Beth at 530-550-8760 x1.

River-Friendly Landscaping



- Reduction of 100 tons of sediment per year will improve water quality in our watershed.
- Creation of wildlife habitat will provide shelter and a diversity of plant species to foster wildlife.
- Removal and prevention of invasive weeds will allow native vegetation to flourish.
- Conservation of water by planting native, drought tolerant plant species will make yards more resilient during droughts.
- Integration of Defensible Space practices will protect against fire.

Project Update: Johnson Canyon

Johnson Canyon is a key tributary to Donner Lake. It has been impacted by waves of human use—from grazing to the construction of Interstate 80 to logging to wildfires. These historical land uses added to water quality problems within the larger Truckee River drainage. During rain or snow events, massive amounts of sediment eroded from Johnson Canyon into Donner Lake via Gregory Creek.

The Truckee River Watershed Council, in partnership with the Truckee Donner Land Trust, completed restoration work in Johnson Canyon in August of this year.

The restoration work took place in the eastern half of the watershed. The project reconnected natural drainage patterns to reduce erosion, improve water quality, restore habitat, and provide recreational access.

The result is an improvement for water quality, wildlife, and recreation!

ALDER CREEK TREE PROTECTION

Leaders: John Brokaw, Ashly Kula

Volunteers: 50

Alder Creek provides important riparian habitat for wildlife, including beavers. To protect selected stands of aspens from beavers, volunteers painted the tree trunks with a mixture including sand. This discourages beavers from eating the painted trees while still leaving plenty of food.

TAHOE DONNER TREE PLANTING

Restoration work was completed in the greenbelt of Tahoe Donner near Donner Ridge, in an area that burned several years ago. Tahoe Donner has been working to restore the landscape. Volunteers planted conifer trees to help promote reforestation.

MARTIS VALLEY BOARDWALK INSTALLATION

The trails that run through Martis Valley go through several wet meadows. In partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Northstar Community Services District, TRWC installed a series of boardwalks to prevent damage to these sensitive habitats. Volunteers helped to maintain and repair one of these boardwalks.

WADDLE RANCH HABITAT PROTECTION

The eastern side of Martis Valley is home to meadows, springs, creeks, and other native habitat. In order to manage recreation, volunteers cleared brush on a trail that will provide recreational access without damaging natural resources.

Prosser Creek is an important spawning area for fish in the Truckee River watershed. However, Prosser Dam blocks the movement of critical material such as spawning gravel. Volunteers, including many from Trout Unlimited, placed appropriately sized gravels in the streambed to improve habitat for fish. Volunteers from the Sodegren Memorial group planted willows, performed erosion control, and consolidated user-created trails.

The Lakeside Campground at Prosser Lake is immediately next to the water. Volunteers helped revegetation on closed off areas by raking seeds and mulch, scattering seeds, and mulching areas. High school students from Truckee High and the Squaw Valley Academy participated at this site.

A trail segment between the Donner Camp and the Prosser Lakeview neighborhood was re-routed by the U.S. Forest Service and Truckee Trails Foundation. The abandoned trail segment ran right next to Alder Creek and was causing erosion problems. Volunteers closed the old trail by planting willows, seeding and mulching.





MARTIS VALLEY MILFOIL SURVEYS

Eurasian milfoil is a harmful, invasive aquatic plant that is becoming established in the Truckee River and other tributaries in the watershed. To effectively get rid of this species, we need to gain an understanding of where populations are located and how widespread they are. Volunteers surveyed several reaches of Martis Creek and mapped milfoil populations.

MARTIS WILDLIFE AREA TRAIL

Martis Wildlife Area is a very popular walking area, especially the user-created Martis Creek Trail. Problems arose because this trail was not properly located or built. Starting in 2004, volunteers have worked to re-route the trail away from the fragile creek banks. In 2014, volunteers performed maintenance on both the new and old trails.

This summer, a fire took place near Boca Reservoir starting from the historic Boca Townsite. The area is fairly steep and vulnerable to erosion. In partnership with the U.S. Forest Service, volunteers seeded the project area with native seeds, and mulched with pine needles to control erosion and prevent weeds from moving into the area. This will help improve water quality.

Truckee Wetlands Restoration Project

The Truckee Wetlands Restoration Project will reconnect historical wetlands. The project starts from the general area of Cottonwood Restaurant on Old Brockway Road, moves east and north toward the old Town of Truckee Corporation Yard, and ends at the Truckee River.

The wetlands within this fragmented complex are not fully functioning. They are degraded; the streams were moved off their original alignment, culverts were poorly installed, storm water runoff and erosion have not been addressed, and buildings, roads and parking lots were incorrectly sited.

The Truckee River Watershed Council began a partnership with willing land managers and property owners to restore and reclaim these wetlands.

The diagram shows the conceptual design for the first phase of the project. In addition to restoring the wetland's soils, plants, surface and ground water connections, the project will include a walking path and interpretive signs.
