	Objective: Provide latest information on projected reservoir operations and model output, increase TRBWG member knowledge about TROA
	Outcomes: See attached presentation.
	Several questions were asked during the presentation: Can reservoir level charts include reference elevations for full, 50%, empty? Yes, Tom can add relevant levels to the graphs.
	How would 300 cfs release from Tahoe translate to flows at Truckee or Floriston? Projected flow rates include expected input from "side water" and releases from reservoirs are adjusted accordingly.
	Why isn't the discharge from Tahoe cycled day vs. night to provide more water during the day for recreation? This type of fluctuation hasn't previously been brought up, and would be very difficult to implement given the operational constraints in the system.

How is Boca evaporation related to water level, i.e. does evaporation increase with increasing surface area? The evaporation calculations vary by reservoir and they are included in the TROA modeling software.

Why is Stampede so low? Significant water has been and will continue to be released from Stampede in the near future to support the Pyramid Lake fishery – both cui-ui and Lahontan cutthroat trout spawning.

Is acceptable ramping occurring where we see the vertical drops in the reservoir outflows? This question was answered in the DWR slides on the use of the California guidelines.

What are the critical months for maintaining healthy invertebrate populations? Native macroinvertebrates evolved under a natural flow regime. While California would like to mimic a natural hydrograph in the Truckee River Basin in California it is not possible due to reservoir operations.
